The launch of the TangaYetu TV Show served a vital purpose, focusing on showcasing the positive transformations resulting from existing projects within the TangaYetu initiative. The TV Show aims to inform and educate the audience about the various initiatives available in the city under TangaYetu.

Through compelling storytelling and direct interviews, the Show will effectively demonstrate the goals, achievements, implementation strategies and the beneficiaries who have benefited from these projects. It will also notably feature the collaborative efforts of key partners involved in the execution of these initiatives, including Foundation Botnar and the Tanga City Council.

## Structure and content of TangaYetu TV Show

The TangaYetu TV Show is set to be broadcasted four times a week through Tanga TV, the show has been carefully designed to encompass various projects implemented under the TangaYetu Program. The show will be aired every Saturday at 7:30 p.m and repeated every Sunday at 9 p.m., Wednesday at 3 p.m., and again at 9 p.m. Each session will span 30 minutes, offering in-depth insights into the specific projects executed within the TangaYetu program.



Following the successful launch of television. TangaYetu а dynamic roadshow was organized by PRISM Communication in partnership with Tree of Hope and Tanzania Youth Talent Association (TAYOTA )organizations. the show was conducted for two days on 26th and 27th May 2023, the roadshow reached 10 wards within the Tanga City Council, including Mwanzange, Msambweni, Mabawa. Mzingani, Makorora, Kiomoni, Mzizima, Chumbageni, Maweni, and Pongwe.

The primary objective of the roadshow was to educate and raise awareness about TangaYetu while promoting a reduction and prevention of the incidents of violence against children and adolescents through the provision of Gender Based violence education by the community mobilizers from Tree of Hope and TAYOTA.

This May newsletter also showcases the notable advancements achieved through the Robotech Labs: Tanzania Open Innovation project. Since its inception, this initiative has effectively empowered youth by offering training and educational opportunities across multiple sectors, utilizing technology to facilitate income generation through entrepreneurial endeavour. While operating independently as an institution, the Tanzania Open Innovation Organization has actively undertaken its own projects within Tanga City. These initiatives encompassed the provision of electronic bicycles, the manufacturing of solar lights for rural areas, the introduction of Robot training, and the production of larvae for animal feed using black soldier flies.

With a total involvement of 40 young individuals, Robotech Labs also engaged with local schools, where students received technology education and collaborated with other community members and successfully reached all 27 wards in the Tanga city. Mr. Shaukatali Hussein, the founder and technical director of Robotech Labs shared inspiring stories of youth beneficiaries who have flourished as a result of the initiative.

One such example is Abdul Malick, who received training in egg incubation through the project. Today, he runs a thriving company called **KUKU KONGWE SOLUTION.** Similarly, Mama Bora stands as another testament to the project's impact. She secured a loan for black soldier flies production and diligently repaid it, eventually forming a group of empowered mothers.
